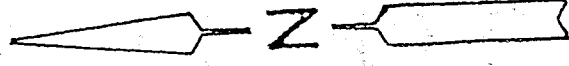
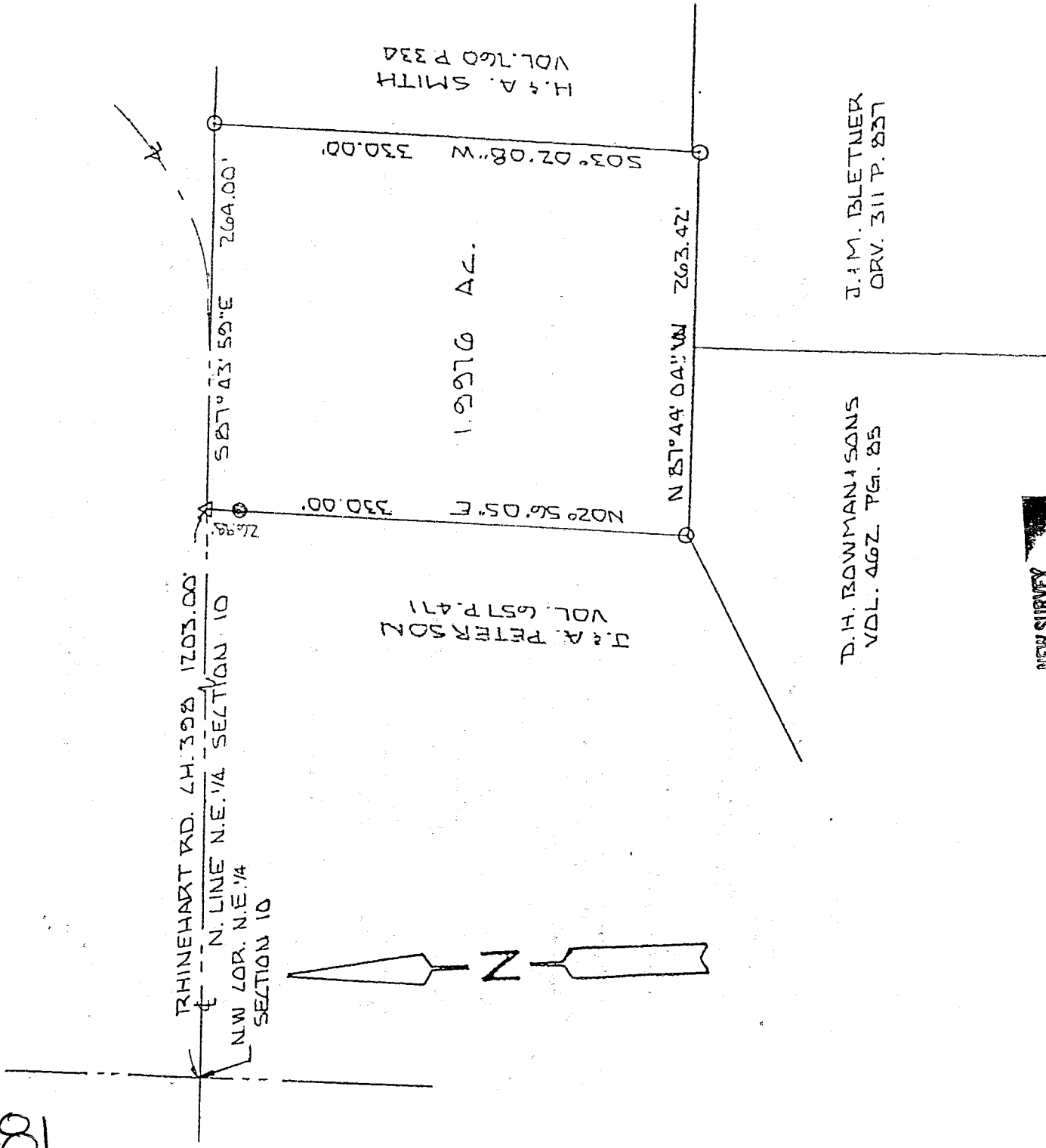

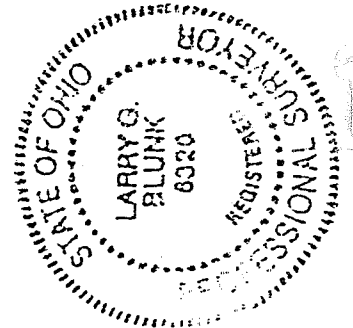

FOR  
DARRIN REMALEY

Located in the Township of Jefferson, County of Richland, State of Ohio and being a part of the Northeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 19, Range 18 and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest Corner of the Northeast Quarter of Section 10.

Thence S 87 degrees 43' 59" E along the north line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 10, said line also being the centerline of Rhinehart Rd. C.H. 398, a distance of 1203.00 feet to a pk nail set and the True Place of Beginning.

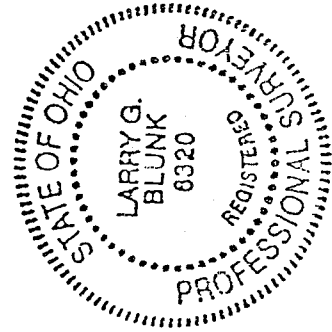
Thence continuing S 87 degrees 43' 59" E along the north line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 10 a distance of 264.00 feet to an iron pin set.

Thence S 03 degrees 02' 08" W a distance of 330.00 feet to an iron pin set.

Thence N 87 degrees 44' 04" W a distance of 263.42 feet to an iron pin set.

Thence N 02 degrees 56' 05" E passing thru an iron pin found at 303.20 feet a total distance of 330.00 feet to the True Place of Beginning and containing 1.9976 acres more or less but subject to all legal highways also all easements of record.
