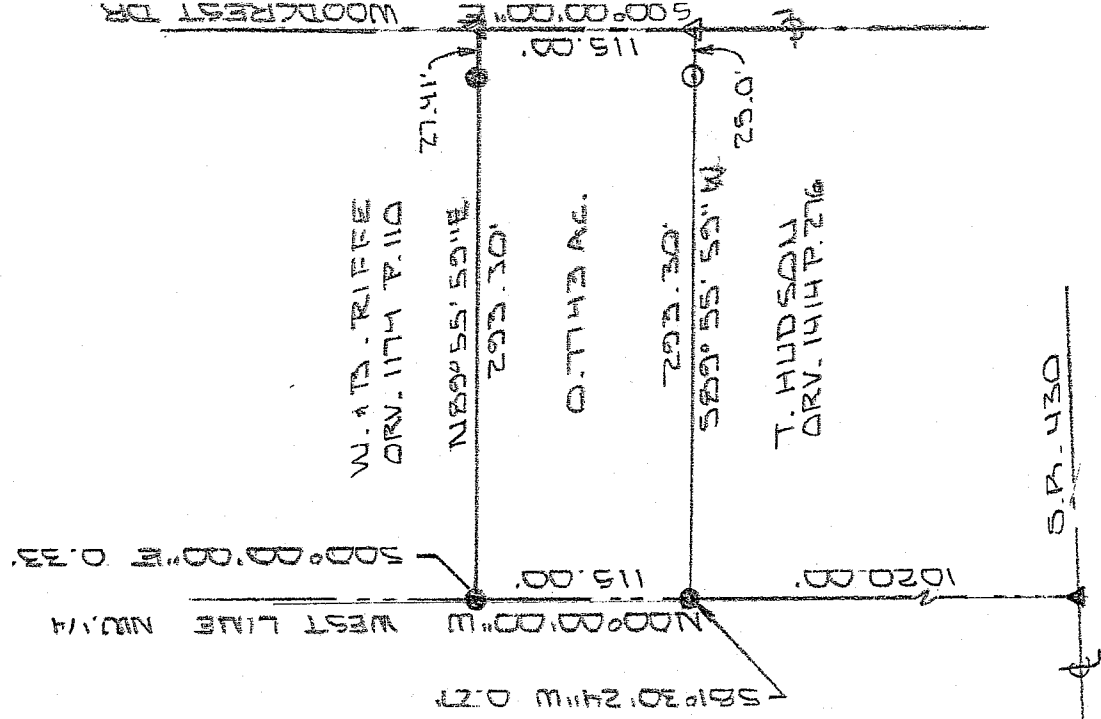


PLAT OF SURVEY FOR LEE RAY HARP

 QUARTER NW RICHLAND COUNTY, OHIO

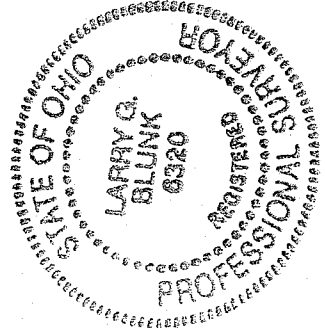

**DESCRIPTION
FOR
LEE RAY HARP**

Located in the Township of Mifflin, County of Richland, State of Ohio and being a part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 19, Township 23, Range 17 and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a pk nail found on the west line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 19 with its intersection with the centerline of S.R. 430.

Thence N 00 degrees 00' 00" W along the west line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 19 a distance of 1020.00 feet to the True Place of Beginning, referenced by an iron pin found S 81 degrees 30' 24" W - 0.27 feet.

Thence continuing N 00 degrees 00' 00" W along the west line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 19 a distance of 115.00 feet to a point, referenced by an iron pin found S 00 degrees 00' 00" E - 0.33 feet.

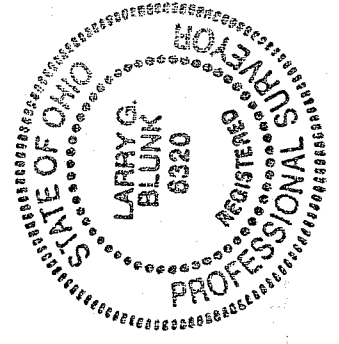
Thence N 89 degrees 55' 59" E passing thru an iron pin found at 265.89 feet a total distance of 293.30 feet to a mag nail set in the centerline of Woodcrest Dr..

Thence S 00 degrees 00' 00" E along the centerline of Woodcrest Dr. a distance of 115.00 feet to a mag nail set.

Thence S 89 degrees 55' 59" W passing thru an iron pin set at 25.00 feet a total distance of 293.30 feet to the True Place of Beginning and containing 0.7743 acres more or less but subject to all legal highways also all easements of record.

Basis of Bearings: Bearings are to an assumed azimuth and are used to denote angles only.
